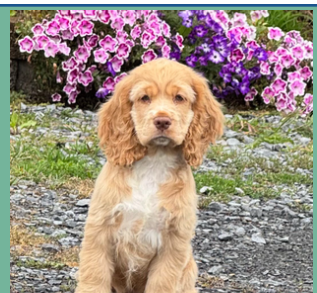
Sugar and Spice

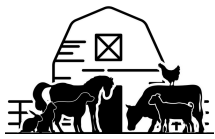

Maggie Mae

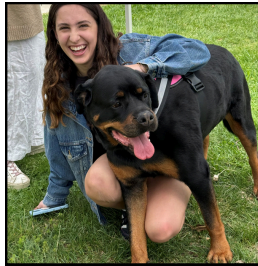
